Preface

Different levels of disaster plans are prepared with the help of Gujarat State Disaster Management Authority for rescue operations, relief operations and rehabilitation etc.

Various types of natural calamities in the past in the state of Gujarat and rescue of the affected during such calamities and Gujarat State Disaster Management Act-2003 has been implemented in the state of Gujarat for the purpose of providing proper guidance and regulation for relief operations. With this Act, responsible officials at all levels, the functions and responsibilities to be performed by the institutions and the entire administration are provided.

The district administrative system, various departments and local organizations of the district have to carry out some operations on war footing so that rescue and relief operations can be carried out immediately in natural or man-made calamities like storm, fire, accident, earthquake. At the time of disaster, it is very important to create an atmosphere of safety and trust among the people. All the operations have to be done largely by the local management system. Complete information must be maintained at the district level for immediate contact with voluntary organizations etc. involved in rescue and relief operations by the concerned government departments. Keeping this fact in mind, the district disaster management plan has been prepared for the purpose of making information available to the people and the related stakeholders easily at the time of disaster based on the time to time instructions issued by the state government and the information available at the district level. Introduction

A district is an important administrative unit for preparedness, prevention and response measures in times of crisis, disaster and emergency. Districts can play an important role in disaster management through the participation of local institutions, and state service and infrastructure support. Integrating disaster risk reduction activities into development programs at the district level can reduce the impact of

disasters by combining important activities such as disaster preparedness, prevention and capacity building with existing development programmes. As such, integrated watershed development programme, can be linked to flood control, drought prevention and mitigation of storm hazards. In the Indira Awas **Scheems** , sanitation can be brought to the rural level by strengthening health services under the construction of safe housing, the National Health Mission and the Complete Sanitation Campaign. Existing District Disaster Management Plan Gujarat State Disaster Management Act 2003, Prepared under Disaster Management Act 2005 and State Disaster Management Policy 2002.

.1 Objectives of District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP):-

Main objectives are District Disaster Management Plan will help in planning and implementing district level disaster management activities.

- ✓ To determine the aid area, population and properties Dangerous and non-hazardous.
- ✓ To identify and mobilize resources required for disaster management.
- ✓ To notify district level authorities and functions of various departments.
- ✓ To provide support for mutual coordination between various departments and authorities
- ✓ Recommend concrete measures for preparedness, response, prevention, and mitigation
- ✓ Identifying needs for capacity building of the authority and community.
- ✓ To suggest a context for mainstreaming In planning development programmes(DRR),

1.2 Guiding Approach Principles.

- District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) Prepared with reference to Guiding Principles of Gujarat Disaster Management Act 2003, National Disaster Management Act 2005.
- District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) to take into account the humanitarian principles of people's participation, decentralized self-governance, gender equality, social justice, human rights and social inclusion.
- District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) Taluka Disaster Management Plan (TDMP) and Village Disaster Management Plan (VDMP) Prepared in a complementary and helpful manner.
- District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) It should help in making action plans for various crises. In this plan, the aspects of pre-preparedness, prevention, resistance should be noted separately and specific tasks assigned to different departments.

.2 District Disaster Management Plan of Aravalli Process :-

Aravalli District Plan 2022 was studied to prepare Aravalli District Disaster Management Plan-2023. A preliminary meeting was held at the district level in which the planning sheet and checklist were reviewed. In this plan HVRCA Assessment, analysis and mitigation activities were discussed. As these aspects are not in the existing plan or checklist DDMCP planning was organized with the members and departmental officers to prepare the plan. Then, based on the plan sheet, each department prepared a department wise sheet regarding the type of information to be compiled and sent, which was given to that department. In the meeting of officials in Aravalli district, the various information of the paper and the main tasks of the plan were discussed and also the representatives of the health department, agriculture, animal husbandry, housing, education, water supply department etc. were consulted about the main tasks of the plan. That crisis (HAZARD) Potential villages were identified.

- **Aravalli District Dangers**

Gujarat Government Notification No. 15th August 2013-Gujarat Land Revenue Code 1879, Section-7 Notification No. Revenue Department No.GHM/2013/69/M/PFR/102013/139/LA new Aravalli

district has come into existence by dividing 6 talukas out of the total 13 talukas of Sabarkantha district. 17 villages of Bhiloda taluka have been included in Himatnagar taluka.

Aravalli district is located in the north-eastern direction of the state of Gujarat. Among the rivers flowing from north to south in this district are Meshvo, Majum and Vatrak. The district headquarters is Modasa. The district has a total of 6 talukas and two municipalities Bayad and Modasa are functioning. The state highway passes through the district. This highway is connected to the state of Rajasthan. Meghraj, a small part of Malpur, and Bhiloda taluk of the district are the taluks with tribal population. The district is named Aravalli because of the Aravalli mountain ranges in the eastern belt. Cotton and pulses are the main crops here as the land is mainly sandy and loamy.

The risk of industrial accident is common in this district. Irregularity of rainfall leads to frequent shortages and drought conditions. The district has suffered the effects of continuous droughts during the 1970s to 1980s. Bhiloda, Meghraj, Malpur talukas of the district are drought prone. The district is prone to floods due to rivers like Meshvo, Mazm, and Vatrak. This plan has identified 41 such villages in the district **DDMC** Prepared by Which will be implemented by various departments under the leadership of the Collector. The National Highway No. 8 passes through this district, so this highway is considered dangerous for transportation of chemicals from Delhi to Mumbai. In the past, around 15 people have died when an acid tanker overturned at Shamlaji. The State Highway extends from Baid to Shamlaji-Ratanpur. Around 15 places in the district have been identified as accident prone zones.

2.Organizational structure and Plan

2.1 Organizational Structure

Aravalli district has been newly formed and departmental functions are being carried out by District Panchayat Aravalli and District Panchayat Sabarkantha Panchayat. In future the following departments will be actively working departments in the disaster management process. Representatives of those departments will be included in the Disaster Management Committee.

2.2 The Act to Reference :-

Making a disaster management plan is mandatory under the Gujarat Disaster Management Act 2003 and the National Disaster Management Act 2005. Furthermore, the National Disaster Management Authority has issued instructions and guidelines to each state for preparing a disaster management plan. As per Gujarat Disaster Management Act 2003 in Chapter 6 Section 15, Sub-section (1,2 and 3) of the functions of the Authority has been instructed to formulate guidelines for disaster management plan and strategy.

1. According to the National Disaster Management Act 2005, the state authority has to formulate a policy and plan on disaster management as per sub-section (1,2 and 3) in section 18 of this act. The District Disaster Management Plan shall take into account the techno-legal perspective of the District and State authorities and other Acts and policies of the Government. Periodically changing policies, regulations should be reviewed and necessary amendments should be made.

Provision for the plan operation

As per Chapter 13, Section 32 of the Gujarat State Disaster Management Act, 2003, necessary provision has been prescribed in the management plan for declaring any area as disaster prone or disaster prone. These provisions are as follows:

Where a disaster has occurred or there is a threat of disaster

- A. If this area is spread over more than one district, the Commissioner and
- b. If spread in one district only, Collector Shri Satware will send its report to the State Government.

On the basis of this report, the State Government will issue a notification regarding the declaration of disaster or potential disaster through Government Gazette or through newspapers of wide circulation. The concerned authorities (State authorities, Commissioners, Collectors, Departments and other agencies) shall perform their duties with respect to disaster management from the time of declaration till the end or even during the extended period. Commissioners, Collectors and heads of agencies may postpone or cancel their day-to-day functions in view of the calamity. If any disaster appears or occurs in any particular district or one or two districts, the Provincial Officer and or the Collector may declare the area of the district as disaster prone or disaster prone with the coordination of the concerned district authorities.

2.3 Plan Maintenance (Annual)

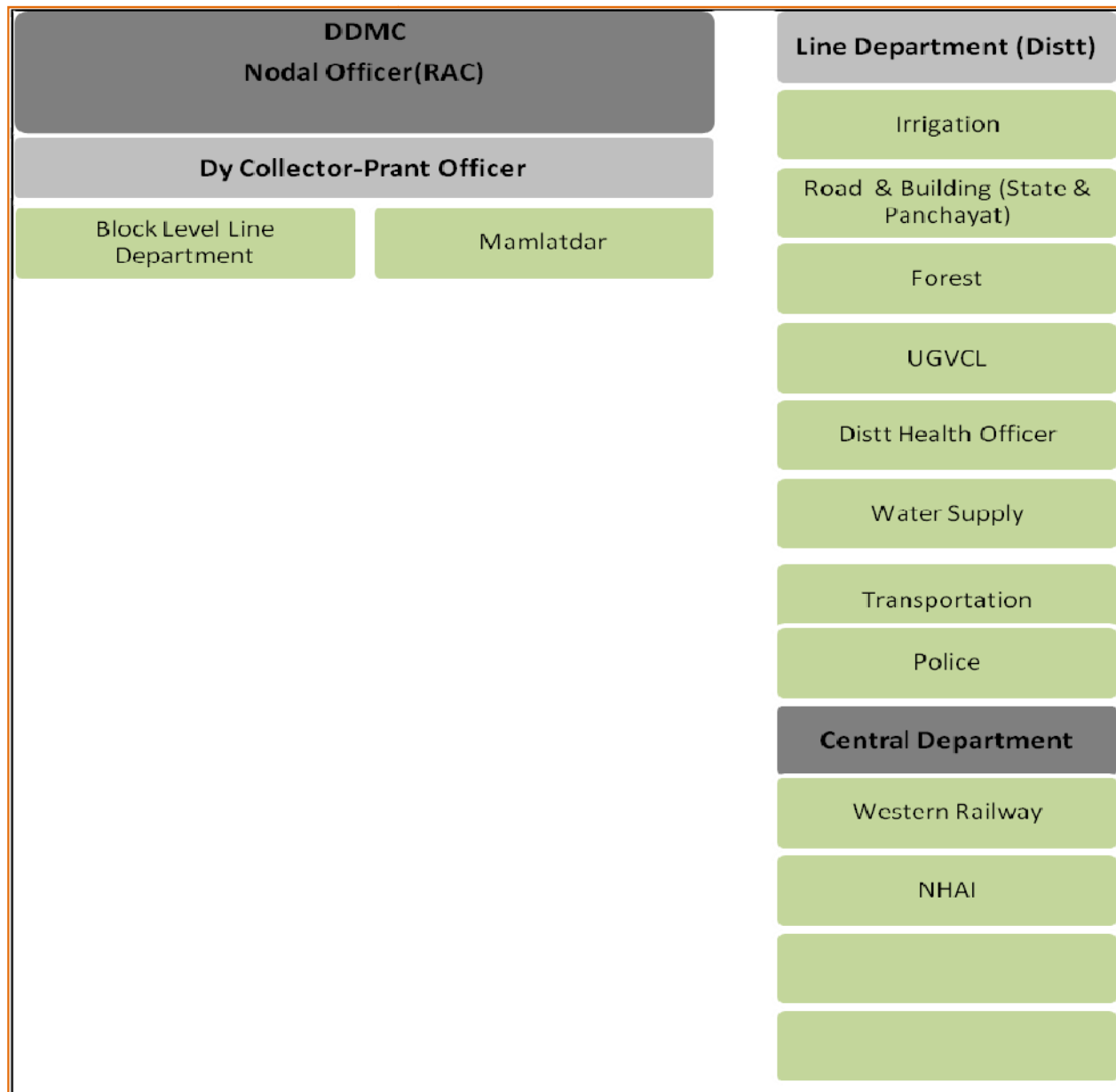
The District Disaster Management Committee will revise the plan from time to time based on the experiences and lessons learned and the increased capacity at the district level to deal with disasters.

But due to lack of repair and maintenance, these lakes are not replenished due to obstruction in the catchment area of the lake. Drinking water is supplied by tankers to some villages every year. In the last five years, efforts have been made by the Water Supply Board and WASMO to provide piped water to every village. As there is no special arrangement at the family level for rainwater harvesting, the villagers have to depend on irregular piped water or village wells. These wells dry up with the onset of summer.

A network of underground pipelines is being prepared for transpotation of chemicals and gas. The local community has no idea where and how serious these chemicals and gases are. So, in the future, industrial accident can become the biggest danger or disaster than drought, flood, storm etc.

- **District of the HRVC Analysis**

Thunderstorms and floods are likely. The district is located in earthquake seismic zone 3 so there is also a moderate probability of earthquakes. In this area, road transports raw materials like chemicals, gas, etc. to industries. Adjacent to Purvapatti Rajasthan, this district is frequently affected by drought and traditional rainwater harvesting systems are either non-existent or non-functional. No industries are particularly developed in this district but in the last 5 years there is a significant increase in the number of agro-based cold storages, apart from floods, the district is prone to highway accidents. Chances of accidents are high for vehicles carrying chemicals

- **Risk from transportation of hazardous ceramics and gases**

The raw materials of industries like chemicals, gas, etc. are transported from around these villages due to transportation from highways in Aravalli district. During transportation, such vehicles are likely to be accidentally linked to surrounding villages and have adverse effects of gas. so that HAZMAT It is necessary to organize the transportation system according to the principles and create awareness among the local people

- **Analysis of helpless groups**

Groups with special need

In times of emergency, the entire affected community needs help, but there are individuals and groups with special needs in our society who need special care. Individuals who have one or more physical impairments or disabilities such as blind or visually impaired, walking, speaking, hearing, or memory impairments may face difficulties during a disaster. Special arrangements should be made for them to get quick help. Some disabilities are obvious while others are difficult to detect and understand, such as heart disease, sensory and mental pain, arthritis and rheumatism, allergies, asthma, chemical reactions, respiratory problems, vision, hearing and brain problems. etc

✓ **Persons with disabilities are hindered in performing certain tasks such as,**

- Difficulty walking or using steps (joint pain, wheelchair, walking stick, crutches and hand crutches)
- Fatigue, shortness of breath, weakness (temporary and permanent)
- Heart disease, asthma, lung problems, or any other symptoms that cause shortness of breath due to stress, fatigue, and movement.
- Mental, intellectual, thinking and understanding problems
- sightless

In the analysis of helplessness in Aravalli district tribals and elderly destitute are most at risk. generally social, economic, Due to educational and political backwardness, caste/Jan jati is unable to withstand the potential threat. This group needs to be prioritized in pre-disaster warning, evacuation, first aid and early relief. Generally the people of this group live in the outskirts of the village where information and facilities do not reach them. The access of which needs to be verified. Sarkarshree has calculated the B.P.L. Giving priority to families also in disaster management operations. Special programs for such groups should be organized in the annual work plans of DRDA, special importance should be given to such programs in tribal development plans.

In the above assessment, it is seen that, traditionally, capacity has been developed through skilled human resources, machinery and resources at the district level for potential hazards like drought, flood, cyclone and earthquake. Aravalli district is 70 km from Ahmedabad city. Being within walking distance, many emergency services and resources are possible and easy to access from Ahmedabad. Industrial crisis is likely due to fast growing industries. Therefore the following measures should be taken to increase the capacity of the district level.

1. At industry level (Off Site) For this, advance preparation and recovery plan should be prepared.
2. Prepare trained response teams to deal with chemical and gas spill incidents and conduct regular mock drills with necessary resources.
3. Coordinating the resources of various departments of the district and formulating emergency response strategies.
4. Regular training of government and non-government organization staff at various levels
5. LCG (Local Crisis Management Group) to prepare inventory of hazardous ceramic and gas used in industrial units and place anti-dots in this regard in local treatment centers.
6. The disaster plan of each department should be reviewed at the district level
7. The government should appoint subject experts in the district disaster unit
8. The government should seriously think about the benefits and permanent livelihood of the employees who are working under disaster management..

5.Prevention and Mitigation Programs

Carry out prevention and mitigation operations and non-structural works to reduce the effects of disasters. Construction and associated operations in infrastructure works that help mitigate risk. To carry out tasks like public awareness, capacity building, change in practice, formulation and implementation of safety regulations in non-structured activities.

✓ Mitigation functions are of two types as follows;

1. Structural functions: On site construction and engineering, physical work.
2. Unstructured functions: Studies, research, regulations, policies, capacity building etc.

DDMP Such activities related to each crisis can be planned and integrated into the programs of various departments. E.g. MNREGA works can prevent flooding by constructing flood protection embankments, planting trees etc. Incorporating safety standards into housing construction can reduce the impact of earthquakes. Coordinating that each department should include such tasks in its work plan DDMP The executor can. Annually review such works and keep making necessary improvements in them.

5.4 Organizational planning

According to the Disaster Act, each department has to prepare a disaster management plan for its activities. of which DDMC coordinate with. Apart from this, it is necessary to conduct separate safety audits and planning for various buildings in the district, places where large numbers of people gather and where there is a risk of danger. Such places can be as follows.

Plans have to be prepared by all the departments at the district level with the coordination of the District Disaster Management Committee. This should include mitigation, preparedness and response.

School complex should be the safest place for children. Under the Right to Education Act 2008 in the district SMC are made. Make a safety plan in every school under its coordination. Under such a plan schools are made safe and students and teachers are empowered DDMP to include details of such school level plan in

Under the National School Safety Program every school has to prepare a disaster management plan with the participation of school students, teachers and parents. The main objectives of this plan are as follows:

- Assessing the risk, vulnerability and capacities of school buildings.
- Identify helpful organizations around the school that can help in a disaster.
- Preparation of training, mock drill topics and schedule for school safety.
- Prepare a plan for the safe evacuation of children in an emergency.
- To lay down working methods and measures for complete safety of fire, laboratory etc.
- Prepare a list of important telephone numbers, contact persons and addresses of service providers at the school level.
- Collect and store safety equipment, machines, medicines, first aid, clothing etc. so that they can be used during disaster.

5. Preparation for Response

An emergency requires both pre- and post-response. Push for planning to respond ICS to prepare Preparation is useful in coordinating with various organizations, departments, determining structured and non-structured tasks etc. In this plan ICS should be done so that 3C (Command, Control and Communication) is done properly and giving timely and effective response.

ICS In the east Warning, search and rescue, humanitarian aid, first aid, relief, temporary accommodation, water and sanitation, law and order, animal care, grievance redressal, rehabilitation and reconstruction are important issues.

6.1 Early Warning System (EWS) and post-disaster notifications

It often happens that the message and warning about a disaster cannot be conveyed to the people in remote areas in time. Sometimes information spread by rumors before and during a disaster creates panic and misunderstanding among people. Therefore, delivering a clear, appropriate warning message to the right group at the right time can minimize the effects of a disaster. To deliver reliable information in a timely manner ICS is important.

6.2 Advance arrangements

When a disaster strikes, if there is not enough material, machinery, equipment, there is a hindrance in meeting the needs of the people. By making advance arrangements, the trouble can be avoided to a large extent. Properly "stock pile" Doing so makes it easy to get instant help.

There are four important steps to advance planning;

1. Prepare list of required materials according to area and hazard. For this considering the helplessness, consumption and culture of the people of the area.
2. The quality and standard of the equipment to be collected should be considered so that quality material is collected.
3. To determine the vendors and sources that can deliver such equipment.
4. Pre-arrangement of material godowns, network of suppliers ready for prompt delivery of services.
5. Such arrangements can be made at the district headquarters and at different cluster levels in the district. To work for such arrangement at panchayat level also.

✓ Preparatory measures for chemical and industrial unit and storage

- To regularly introduce, revise and update safety policies.
- To carry out regular maintenance and inspection of important machinery.
- Monitoring and reporting on the implementation of legislation.
- Ensuring accident reporting, investigation and investigation of causes.
- Take proactive and reactive measures to increase safety awareness.

7.Response Plan

An effective response requires the creation of an incident command system with clear responsibilities. To equip each task force commander with specific training. The District Level Incident Commander (Provincial Officer Mr/Collector) which assigned to the Commander of the Task Force for effective disaster response *SOP* Instructing to take action accordingly. During a disaster, each task force leader reports to the Incident Commander and executes the coordinated plan.

7.4Media Management

The role of print and electronic media is important in conveying disaster warnings and details. The media can play an important role in mitigating the sufferings of the community by acting decently at such times. It can provide good information about disaster preparedness, response methods, survival methods etc. to the people in a wide manner. In general, it is very important for the community to get clear and correct information in any crisis or disaster. So the role of media is very important.State level EOThe state government has made arrangements to coordinate with the media by starting a media cell in Which is continuously working. Periodical updating of print and electronic media by proper authority during disaster to prevent spread of unnecessary rumors and irresponsible information. During such a system disaster DEOC Even at the level, seek his help.

8.Recovery Plan

The plan aims to restore or improve the disaster-affected area and people. Disasters affect essential services, infrastructure, people's livelihoods, health and entire lifestyles. So quickly restore all these aspects. Consider this strategy to restore physical infrastructure and essential services.

Build better than ever: To carry out new construction works in such a way that they are not damaged in such calamities again. Participatory planning–To construct fairs and functions keeping in mind the social and cultural style and needs of the people. For this, participation of stakeholders in planning is essential.

Coordination:Preparation of rehabilitation plan in coordination with various departments. Immediate damage assessment and assessment of people's needs are important aspects of such planning.

To rehabilitate or operationalize the following various sectors.

- Important services–Electricity, Water, Communication, Transport, Sanitation, Health.
- Structures/Construction–Housing, public buildings and roads
- Livelihood–Agriculture, cottage industry, shop and market and employment.

Electricity, water, sanitation, sewage disposal etc. services to be started immediately. To predetermine alternative strategies and tasks for launching such service. Seek help from local organization, departments, corporate if needed.

If this kind of training need identification process and training demand is prepared at the district level then the training planning at the district level and state level will be of better quality.

Continue to test disaster preparedness through mock drills and simulations along with training. In all schools, hospitals, important government offices, big corporate houses on different topics like fire, earthquake, flood etc. safety and preparedness personal/Regularly conducting mock drills with the help of external experts to check collective preparedness. By which deficiencies in the preparation can be identified and rectified.

Such as mock drills can be done for pre-preparedness aspects such as search-rescue, safe egress, first aid, etc., in which pre-preparedness of police, fire, health services, rescue forces, etc. can be assessed. This method is also very useful for improving self preparedness of people studying and working in schools and offices.

- It is mandatory for the industrial units to spread awareness about the hazardous chemicals of the unit to the people living in the area where the accident of the industrial unit is likely to affect.
- It is a fact that a conscious community around can be helpful to both the industrial unit and the authorities.
- It is the joint responsibility of the government, the industrial unit and the community to make the community aware and alert. Coordination between all these is essential.
- It is necessary to organize a system of mutual communication so that the community–industry–Authority can coordinate and prepare.

(1)Shamraji Temple



The legendary Vishnu temple is situated shamraji in Bhiloda Taluka, Aravalli district. Fair is being organized from kartak sud teras to kartak sud punam at shamraji. On those days & as well as normal days visitor .Vishnu temple,Vishnu for adequate parking space for passenger vehicles at ShamrajiThe temple is managed by Shamraji's Trust.Ease of parking of vehicles, P.S.E Shri Shamraji regarding traffic management and making proper arrangements to allow the pilgrims to enter the Patangan of the temple by the police and home guards in such a way that there is no rush of pilgrims.through Formal planning is carried out.

In the main entrance part of the temple, man and women A separate line of separate lines of both are being made in order to avoid rush.

Arrangements have been made by the temple trust to store goods and shoes in the temple's patangan. For the aim of security and management employee of the security agency have been deployed. Separate paths for incoming and outgoing have been made. For men and women, Nagdhara Kund is used for bathing—There is a separate tank arrangement.As well as the police for security purposesAlso making arrangements for deployment came.An Executive Magistrate is appointed from Kartak Sud Teras to Kartak Sud Punam for smooth organization of the fair to be held at Vishnu Temple, Shamraji.Gram Panchayat Shamraji and Vishnu Mandir Trust to arrange drinking water stalls and mobile toilets from time to time to provide adequate facilities to the pilgrims throughout the fair and to keep vigilance regarding cleanliness.,Shamraji has been informed.

(2) Meshwo Dem:



Meshwo Dam site at Shamlaji for the purpose of 24*7 police deployment to prevent any Untoward incident. Action has been taken Appropriate technical arrangement have been made by deputy executive engineer irrigation (state).

(3) Dipeshwari Temple



There is a famous temple of Dipeshwari Mataji at Unterada in Bayad Taluka. A fair is held at Sadar place on every Punam day. A large number of participate in it. Dipeshwari Mataji Temple, Uttarada. Ease of parking of vehicles, the Temple Trust at Adequate parking for people vehicles has been arranged. Traffic management as well as entry of pilgrims at the time of entry to temple patangan by police and home guard to prevent rush of public. A sign board with details of previous drowning incidents, cautionary measures and danger spots have been put up around. there are four to five different ways to reach Zanzari Falls, on festival days / public holidays and on Saturdays / Sundays, there is a high volume of people coming and going.

Ambaliyara has been advised. Regarding taking precautionary measures In addition, the proposal to develop zhanzari Falls as a tourist destination also includes the construction of safety railings around the falls, which, if approved, will enable intensive security and also the information with mobile number of the swimmers of the surrounding village is kept. where immediate rescue is required so that tourists do not bathe in deep water. Police/Home Guards have been deployed to keep vigilance at dangerous places like Zanzari Falls/riversides. The office of Mamlatdar, Bayad, life jackets, tubes and rescue systems have been kept to pull people out of the water. Because of there is no boating facility at zhanzari Falls there is no question of getting inspection or maintenance and safety certificate.

The above mentioned tourist places are located in the Aravalli district, which is located in a very remote area of the district but occasionally crowded but crowded. in the district where large number of tourists visit and take the following special precautionary measures for safety at such places. spots/public places It is necessary to check/identify the various tourist place.

- To make proper planning for the safety of the people coming to the above mentioned tourist/public places in Aravalli district so that there is no loss of life and property and any tragic accident can be prevented and rescue and relief measures can be taken immediately.
- Including, Officers- 1) District Development Officer, Aravalli (2) District Superintendent of Police, Aravalli (3) Provincial Officer, Modasa/Bayed, (4) Chief District Health Officer, Aravalli (5) Executive Engineer, Hon. and m. Division, Aravalli (6) Chief Officer, N.P., Modasa/Bayed (7) C.P.E. Shri., Irrigation (State/Pt), Aravalli (8) Mamlatdar(All).
- To take this issue as a permanent issue in the road safety /coordination /revenue officer meeting held every month under the chairmanship of the district collector and to review this in the meeting every month. Enforcement Officer- (1) Assistant Regional Transport Officer, Aravalli (2) ADM Office, Sadar (3) Coordination Office, Sadar Office.
- Planning is essential. there is a large number of visitors/spectators on certain days and ensure that such places do not congregate in excess of their capacity/space and that there is movement of people from time to time. Places where social and religious gatherings are held, identify the places.
- Keeping separate barricades and safety gates for the movement and safety of people. Regarding making necessary arrangements for fire extinguishers and fire brigade at the place

of gathering in large gatherings. Administrators of Dharamsthan for this work Seeking support of Public Social / Religious Institutions, Trustees.

- Enforcement Officer (1) District Superintendent of Police, Aravalli (2) Provincial Officer, Modasa/Byad, (3) Chief Officer, Municipality Modasa/Byad.
- To take care of dangerous places requiring immediate rescue like beach/riverside visitors to take precautions to avoid bathing in deep water, to make proper arrangements for keeping ready with expert swimmers and necessary equipment life jackets, boats, etc. at such places.
- Implementing Officers- (1) Provincial Officers, Modasa/Bayed, (2) Mamlatdars (All)
- Placing warning sign boards of places where there is deep water in a conspicuous place while performing social / religious pujas, activities along the banks of rivers. The issue of making arrangements for police presence to ensure that people do not go to the accident site along the river during heavy rains or storms during the monsoon season.
- Implementing Officers- (1) District Development Officer, Aravalli, (2) District Superintendent of Police, Aravalli (3) Provincial Officer, Modasa/Bayed, (4) Irrigation (State / Panchayat), Aravalli (5) Mamlatdar (All)
- Pre-accuracy safety check and periodical maintenance of various electric rides, paraglidings, boatings, etc. operated by private agencies for public entertainment at high mountain religious places, ropeways, adventure parks, water parks, trekking points, waterfalls, etc. Have safety certificates been obtained? If necessary, third party inspection should be done from time to time to make sure. Implementing Officer- (1) Provincial Officer, Modasa/Bayed (2) Executive Engineer, M.&M. Department (State) (3) Mamlatdar (All)
- Marchu River at Morbi has caused a major disaster. Collapse of a pool on So that this type of incident does not occur, it becomes necessary to take precautionary measures. It is a matter of verifying the arrangements for the safety of people at such various places and ensuring preparedness by local resources, local government / private organizations so that in case of any emergency immediate rescue measures can be taken and people's lives and property are not damaged. Some things to be aware of in some natural and man-made disasters and before such a disaster, What to do and what not to do during and after a disaster? Tried to cite its guidance disaster outline here, which is politely requested to use.

Strom

That's all you need...

Before the storm

- ✚ Announcements Radio for forecasting, TV Stay in touch with news,
- ✚ Fishermen do not go to sea, anchor the boat in a safe place.
- ✚ Coastal Agariya to evacuate to safety.
- ✚ Strengthening the windows, doors and roof of the house.
- ✚ the lantern, Collect and keep ready the items of immediate need like torch, food items, water, clothes, radio.
- ✚ If necessary and valuable goods can be packed in plastic, move them to the upper floor.
- ✚ To keep vehicles in running condition.
- ✚ Take to a safe place if necessary.

Storm During.....

- ✚ Move away from water sources and do not stand near trees or poles.
 - ✚ Do not leave the house.
 - ✚ Switch off electricity and gas connection.
 - ✚ Close all the windows and doors of the house.
 - ✚ Get correct information from the control room if possible and stay away from rumours
- After the storm
- ✚ Exit only after receiving instructions.
 - ✚ Don't wade through uncharted waters.
 - ✚ Give first aid to the injured and take them to the hospital.
 - ✚ Immediately rescue those trapped in the debris.
 - ✚ Do not touch exposed Cabels
 - ✚ Immediate demolition of dangerously damaged buildings.
 - ✚ Use chlorinated drinking water.
 - ✚ Spraying the medicine into the contaminated water.

Flood

That's all you need...

Before the flood...

- ✚ To construct high plinth houses in From coastal areas.
- ✚ People of should learn to swim flooded areas.
- ✚ Keep listening to news.Radio for predictions, T.V.,
- ✚ According to the instructions of the system, vacate the dangerous place and go to a safe place.
- ✚ To take valuables and documents while vacating the house.Like torch, food items, water, clothes keep an identity document with every member of the family.
- ✚ Move goods from lower floors to upper floors if possible.
- ✚ Move the animals to a safe place.

During the flood...

- ✚ Sit in safe and protected places.
- ✚ Try to get correct information.
- ✚ Follow the government announcement about evacuation.
- ✚ Switch off the power supply - do not touch exposed wires.

After the flood...

- ✚ Avoid drowning if able to float.
- ✚ Do not enter deep uncharted waters.
- ✚ Do not go to the river banks after the flood waters recede.
- ✚ Drink chlorinated water.
- ✚ Drink boiled water - eat only preserved food.
- ✚ Spraying the medicine into the contaminated water.
- ✚ To cooperate with relief survey teams giving correct details of loss.
- ✚ For proper distribution of relief materials, make systematic distribution as per requirement by forming local committee/swain sevak squads.
- ✚ Do not enter dangerous-damaged building.

Earthquake

Before the earthquake...

- ✚ Discuss and give information about earthquake with family members.
- ✚ Making new buildings earthquake safe and strengthening old buildings
- ✚ Insuring your home and family.
- ✚ Do not place heavy and fragile objects on the shelves.
- ✚ Damaged power connections and leaking gas connections should be repaired immediately.

During the earthquake...

- ✚ Don't rush in panic.
- ✚ Running out of the house into the open.
- ✚ Do not use the elevator in the building, going down the stairs.
- ✚ Sit with your head under a strong table or against a strong wall.

After the earthquake...

- ✚ Don't be alarmed by the normal tremors after an earthquake.
- ✚ Radio, TV or listening to government announcements through other media.
- ✚ Do not rush, and not stand on Kathed/Agassi.
- ✚ Get first aid for injuries and help others.
- ✚ Do not enter houses that feel unsafe.
- ✚ water, Switch off electricity and gas.

Industrial/Chemical Accident

That's all you need...

- ✚ If toxic gas is detected in the atmosphere, first move to an open area.
- ✚ To move quickly against the direction in which the wind is blowing to a safe place.
- ✚ Report any gas leakage immediately.
- ✚ Tie a wet handkerchief over the mouth.
- ✚ Operation of trapped men, take the injured to the hospital.
- ✚ Prevent unnecessary persons from entering the affected area.

Drought

- ✚ Water is a precious resource.
- ✚ Prevent water wastage.
- ✚ save water, water will save you.
- ✚ Collect rain water by creating underground tanks with the building.
- ✚ Make underground tanks for water, let's flow the Ganges from house to house.
- ✚ Reuse used water properly.
- ✚ Maximize the use of irrigation methods such as sprinkler or drip.
- ✚ Prevent rain water from flowing into the sea.
- ✚ Grow crops that are ready in less time with less water.
- ✚ Farm pond, to conserve water storage resources and prevent soil erosion by building small check dams and embankments.
- ✚ To increase the richness of ground water by recharging wells and boreholes.
- ✚ Building farms and leveling land.
- ✚ Ponds Checkdams, remove the sediment from the pond and make it deep.
- ✚ To vaccinate and groom the animals properly.
- ✚ Prevent fodder wastage, increase the quality and nutritive value of fodder by giving urea-molasses treatment.
- ✚ Maximize use of natural fertilizers.
- ✚ Maintain soil fertility by rotating crops.
- ✚ Grow additional grass in fallow lands.
- ✚ Store useful grains.
- ✚ Plant more trees, save the environment.

The disease

- ✚ Always filter drinking water, clean and drink.
- ✚ Always keep water vessels clean.
- ✚ Add a drop of chlorine in the drinking water.
- ✚ Drink boiled water and eat only fresh food.
- ✚ In cases of diarrhea and vomiting, take only liquid food.
- ✚ Remove dirt.
- ✚ Around the house–If there is waste, remove it immediately and keep the environment clean.
- ✚ Take steps to prevent mosquito breeding.
- ✚ Keep windows and doors closed at sunset and sunrise.
- ✚ Keep mosquitoes away by smoking mosquito incense sticks or neem leaves.
- ✚ When the medicine is sprayed in your area, get the medicine sprayed at home as well.
- ✚ T.B, polio, diphtheria and measles vaccine.
- ✚ Find drinking water leakages and repair them immediately.
- ✚ Cleared water puddles around the house, spraying the medicine.
- ✚ Weekly emptying and cleaning of household water equipment.
- ✚ Use mosquito net while sleeping at night.
- ✚ Kerosene over saturated water, Spraying of burnt crude oil or other oil.
- ✚ Get a blood test when you have a fever.
- ✚ Do not take any necessary drugs. Take medicine as per the doctor's advice.

During Lightning/Storms Things to keep in mind.

If you are inside the house...

- ▶ Unplug all electrical equipment before a storm hits. Do not use a corded telephone
- ▶ Stay away from windows and doors.
- ▶ Do not touch plumbing and metal pipes. Do not use running water

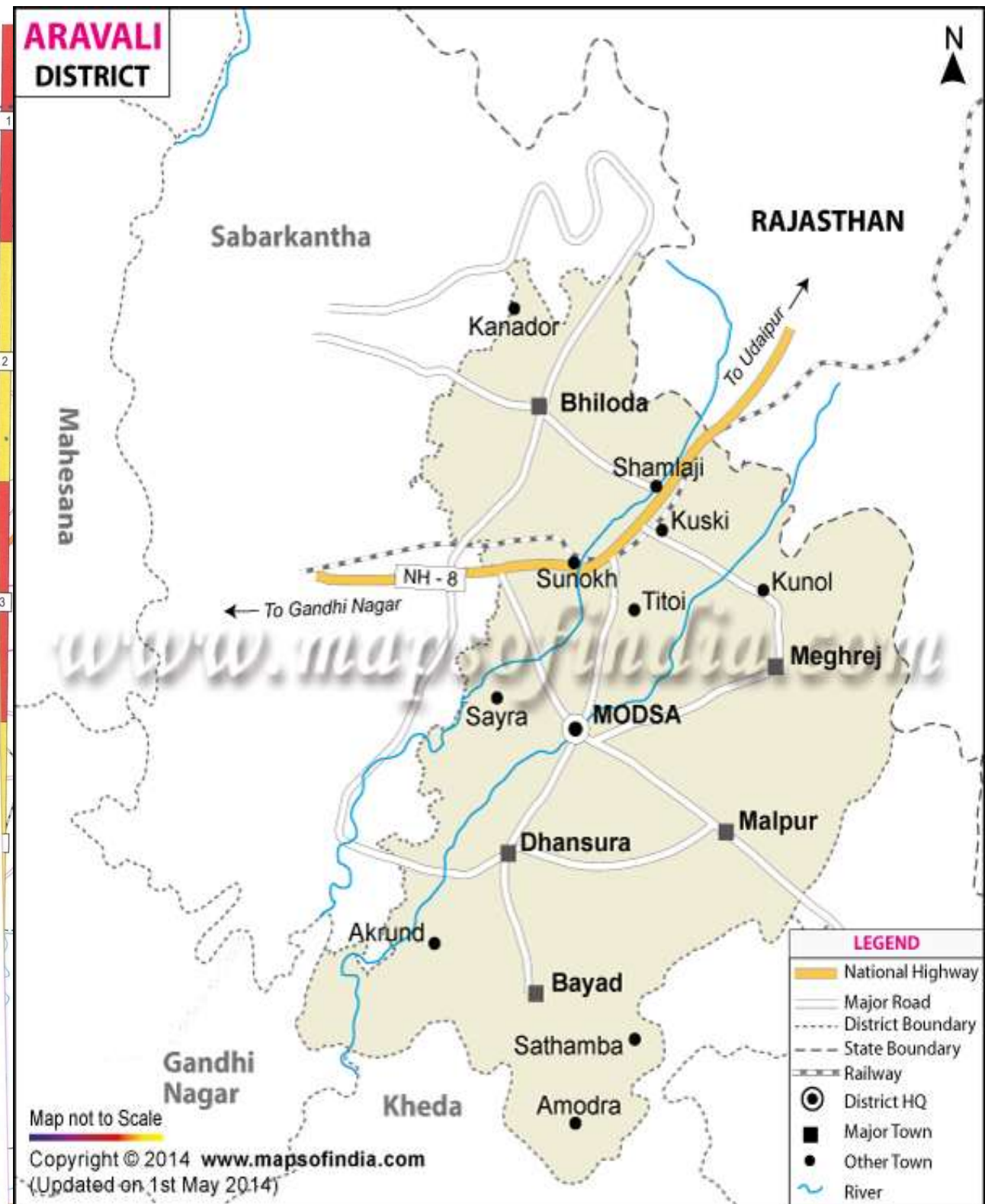
If you are out of the house...

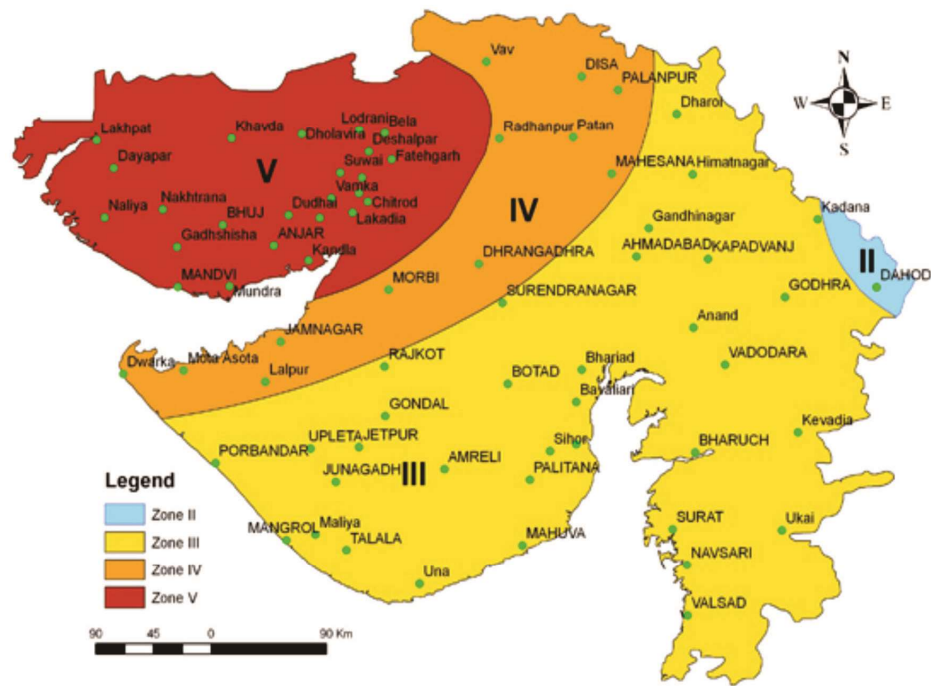
- ▶ Take shelter inside the house / building. Avoid tin roofs / iron structures
- ▶ If in the open sky, then do not lie on the ground or put your head on the ground
- ▶ Do not take shelter near / under trees, not to spread in the crowd

- ▶ If there is water, get out, if in boats in lakes or other waters, come ashore.

Affected treatment

- ▶ If necessary, so CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation).
- ▶ Provide immediate medical treatment.
